

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS



Project/One-Time Funding enabled Librarian Denise Klaus to pilot a Book Vending Machine program at Pine Creek Elementary. In its first year, students earned tokens to exchange for their very own books as part of an AR reading incentive. This addition **impacted all students**, inspiring them to enhance their reading and comprehension skills in a unique way! Based on the success of this pilot, the Foundation plans to **expand the program to all 5 elementary schools** by purchasing each school their very own book vending machines. Books are selected by Librarians to meet District standards and funded by PTOs.



High School STS Teacher Tom Schumacher and FCS Teacher Mallory Mohr received a **Classroom Grant** for Indoor Grow Gardens to expand on the successful outdoor garden and enable year round learning. Now a part of curriculum, this gives students hands-on experience from seed to table!



Out of 5 states and 180 chapters, **TeamMates Mentoring of Bennington** was awarded **2023 National Chapter of the Year** for outstanding "heart-work." The program currently serves 87 matches in Bennington. Learn more and apply to be a mentor today at TeamMates.org.



Hundreds of middle and high school students utilized the **Study Centers** for 700 hours throughout the year.
